

Choosing, Adapting and Using Quilting Designs

Supply List

Prior to class, each student should assemble a small quilt top that will be measured for creating paper templates to fill with perfectly fitting designs.

A \$3.00 fee will be collected from each student for supplies used in class.

Project: For greater accuracy, pre-wash fabric and spray starch before cutting. Cut and assemble pieces in this order:

- Cut 1 12 1/2" center square from a medium to light solid or almost solid fabric.
- For inner border strips use a small print, or almost solid fabric
cut 2 pieces 12 1/2" X 3 1/2" and
2 pieces 18 1/2" X 3 1/2".
- For outer border strips use a border print, small print, solid or almost solid
cut 2 pieces, 18 1/2" X 6 1/2" and 2 pieces, 30 1/2" X 6 1/2".
- Assemble the top using 1/4" seam allowances. Attach two of the narrow borders to opposite sides of the center square, press seams open, and attach the other two sides. The outer borders are added in the same manner. Use spray starch to stabilize fabrics during assembly.
- **DO NOT** layer with batting or backing before class.

Supplies needed in class:

- Pencils and eraser
- Paper scissors
- Any ruler, 6" to 18" (for drawing lines, either drafting or quilting rulers are fine)
- Note taking supplies
- **New**, water soluble fabric marking pens or pencils

Optional supplies All of the paper is supplied, but if you would like, you may bring...

- Quilting stencils (a few interesting designs) to use and share with others.
- Any drawing tools you might like to show the class.
- A grid marker stencil (if you own one and wish to mark a grid)
- Any books, photos or objects showing beautiful quilting, designs in wood or stone carving, jewelry, artwork of any kind, any design that inspires you!
