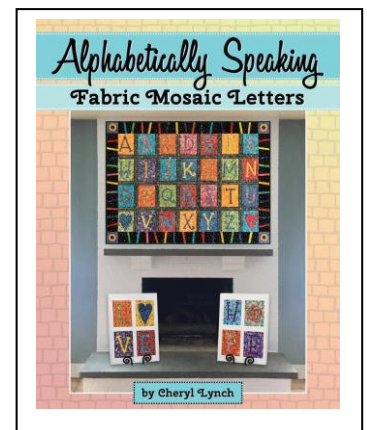
## Library

Arlene Forst has been making and organizing Quilts of Valor for our guild. Featured here are her posts from Facebook this summer so everyone can see them. Block instructions for the first picture follow.

Here is another QOV top completed. What do you think of the blocks? Is anyone interested in making some of these blocks for another top? The block is really easy and finishes 13" raw edge. If you are interested in making some of these blocks I will post the directions in the next Patch.



I think I posted this one before, but it is now on its way to QOV. These blocks were made by [Debbie Wesenberg](#).




These may not be the best pictures, but I have finished a few more tops for the QOV. Thanks to the generosity of the guild, I will be delivering these tops for quilting to the Land of Lincoln Quilts of Valor organization.



Another QOV from the box of donated fabrics from the finished one from blocks [DeAnn Ellis](#) gave me. I will have a picture of that one as well. I still have many many blocks to make tops. I love making these tops.



# Valor Square Block Instructions



**VALOR SQUARE**  
Finished block 12 1/2" Block Designed by Denise Siegel, QOVF Member

**Materials**  
1 fat quarter\* solid or dark print (blue in example)  
1 fat quarter\* solid or medium print (red in the example)  
1 fat quarter\* solid or light print (white in the example)  
\*fat quarter = 18" x 20"

**Guidelines for QOVF Blocks**  
Use red, white or cream, blue and gold fabrics in solids, prints or tone-on-tone

**Cutting**  
Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances

- From solid or dark print, cut (2) 3"x 8" strips *blue*
- From solid or medium print, cut (6) 3"x 3" squares *red*
- From solid or light print, cut (2) 3"x 8" strips and (7) 3"x 3" squares - *white*

**Block assembly**

1. Sew (9) 3" squares alternating colors to create 9 patch square
2. Sew (4) 3" squares alternating colors to create 4 patch square
3. Sew (2) 8" strips of alternating colors together
  - a. Make two (2) alternating color strip units

**Referring to Diagram**

Make 1 block, make ten or as many as you'd like !!!

If you wish, sign the block with your first name and state

Your completed block must measure - with raw edges - 13" **DO NOT trim blocks**
