"Be prepared to dedicate yourself to it (quilting). No one is going to start off being a terrific quilter -


you have to practice." - <u>Marilyn Badger</u>

If you click on the link above for Marilyn Badger, you will see the works of a Master quilter. Perhaps you saw her exhibit at the National Quilt Museum in Paducah last spring. Her quilts there proved that she had indeed put in many hours of practice, probably on quilts that weren't in the exhibit, because practice is where we make our mistakes, rip out, redo, and learn for the next quilt and time.

Some experienced quilters are able to dig through their shelves or drawers and pull out the first quilt they ever made. Some gave that quilt away long ago. In the Member Showcase at the March meeting, a member showed us her first quilt which had recently been finished. It was wonderful and was started in the Mystery class in Spring of 2023. With that quilt and quilter, the guild is fulfilling its purpose of teaching and encouraging new quilters as well as those who have made many quilts.

The workshops offered by the guild provide opportunity to practice skills and learn new ones too. In this guild year we have practiced paper

piecing, free hand cutting, sewing curves and inserting circles. Opportunities are coming to practice wax-resist dyeing, working improvisationally, and using ruler templates to guide machine guilting.

## Fabric Sale Update

The fabric donation contest is complete, and we will announce the winners in April.

I sent out a survey on March 15<sup>th</sup>, asking for volunteers, tables, sheets and more. If you haven't already filled it out, please do so as soon as you can. I'll be sending a reminder this week. I will also be following up before the sale to ensure that we have people working throughout the sale days.

The work isn't hard and schedules can be flexible. Before the sale, we will need people to help sort fabric and arrange it in boxes. The afternoon before the sale, we will set up tables, hang sheets for a backdrop and put the boxes in place. During the sale itself, we need people to weigh fabric, take cash and make change, answer questions and straighten fabric occasionally if it gets too messy.

Here are the key dates:

- April 12 afternoon arrange fabric in boxes
- April 18 afternoon set up the sale at Marilyn's
- April 19 9-1 sale
- April 20 9-1 sale, (1-3 sale closed to reorganize), then 3-5 half price sale

This was great fun last time and is a good way for the guild to make money. You might also find just the right fabrics for your next project – there are some amazing things in the small group of fabric I've seen so far.

If you have more fabric you want to donate, please do so by April 12<sup>th</sup> if you can, so we can organize it with a group of volunteers.

#### **Meeting Minutes**

#### March 14, 2024 Salt Creek Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes

President Linda Johnson welcomed us to the March Guild Meeting at 7p.m. She announced that March is National Quilting Month. Feb. Minutes were approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** Carol Allegretti presented the Treasurer's Report, including the transfer of \$11,900 into a 9 mos. C.D. which will mature in Dec. @ 4% interest.

She noted that there is enough in our checking account to cover this and next year's expenses. Carol also referenced our table at the upcoming Senior Fair at Hinsdale Community House in April.

The Treasurer's Report was approved. (see below)

**Nominating Committee:** Linda Johnson announced the formation of a Nominating Committee under Linda Wolfe and described the positions available. Hospitality and Community Service Chairs are also needed.

**Pizza Fundraiser:** Sandy Taylor updated the Pizza Fundraiser. Marilyn referenced the April 16th Senior Fair at the Hinsdale Community House. S.C.Q.G. is 1 of 50 organizations to have a table. We will have fliers about the Fabric Sale and info on our Guild.
