Pressing Matters – Sign up for the "Iron" Quilter Competition

We need team players! Sign up to be on a team in the Iron Quilter Competition scheduled for February 10th. There will be Finisher Badges!

How does it work?

Three teams, consisting of 4 quilters, are given 2.5 yards of fabric and are tasked to complete a small quilt top in 2 hours! Each of the Team Captains will receive the same 2.5 yards of fabric at the January meeting so they can plan their quilt tops and strategy. They can add one extra fabric of their choosing. No cutting of fabric will be done until the start of the 2-hour competition. Completed quilt tops must be a minimum of 36" on each side. Eventually, the finished quilts will be donated to charity.

Sign up to join a team at the Programs table at the November meeting! You can also join the fun as a spectator. Come and cheer the teams on as they frantically sew their masterpieces while you work on your own projects. When time's up, cast your vote for your favorite.


“Rare and Remarkable Malaysian Batik” How It's Made, Who Makes It and Why It's Important

“Batik on Silk Fabric – Wax-Resist Dyeing”

Artists use substances on textiles to temporarily "resist" dye to create patterns and interest. This workshop explores the use of wax as a resist. Participants will use fabric dyes on silk fabric and learn how to apply wax in layers to create unique hand painted designs. We will use some everyday and some not-so-traditional tools to achieve subtle, sophisticated effects. These beautiful creations can stand on their own and be framed or incorporated into other works such as quilt blocks or pillow fronts. Come have some fun, stretch your imagination, and create art cloth.



Community Service project instructions can be picked up from Lolly at Open Studio on Friday, November 10, or the Community Service workshop on Saturday, November 11.

Library – There are some free books that have been donated to the guild available by the Library table.

Garage Sale – Debbie Wesenberg has lots to buy, including a huge quilt kit for \$70.

Hospitality – Arlene Forst for Fran Colby - Our Holiday Party will be on 12/14 at 7pm. Pizza, pop, salad and a dessert for \$15.00 is planned. Come to relax and socialize. Asking everyone to bring something for a silent auction – Basket, small hangings, baked goods, etc. Monies will go to a charity. 12/1 is the deadline to pay and register.

Retreat – Claudia Moffit - 18 have signed up so far. Dates are Friday 1/26 - Sunday 1/28. Costs per person are \$220 for double, \$295 for single, or \$160 for a commuter. The cost includes 5 meals.

The instructor will be on Zoom, but participants will gather at the room in the Lyons Township building.
